Title: An epidemiologist reflects on what the medical establishment got right and what it got wrong during the pandemic

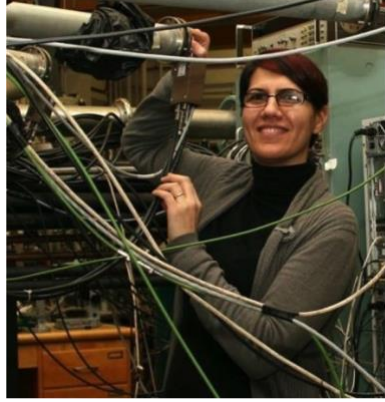
